

SUB AND SIDELINE ANSWERS

1. Any time during the game, three coaches are allowed to be in the two yard belt, which is the area between the front of the team box and the sideline. The two yard belt is only for coaches, except a signer to signal to a deaf player may be present and does not count as one of the three coaches. 9-8-3
2. Because if you went up the other team's sideline, you might get yelled at! This mechanic helps with sideline control, helps with uniformity, and creates an appearance of hustle. What else can you think of?
3. 3-5-10. The player shall be replaced for at least one down, unless the halftime or OT intermission occurs.
4. I missed this one. No foul in either case as A11 and B11 are players, not a replaced player. Have fun with this one.
5. 3-7-5. During a down a replaced player or substitute who attempts unsuccessfully to leave the field and who does not participate in or affect the play, constitutes an illegal substitution.
6. LJ has the game kit. All officials should go over the game kit when they get back to the locker room, before everyone starts getting showers or dressed. It only takes five minutes. Everyone who drives is responsible for making sure the LJ puts travel on the game kit.
7. Yes. We do, even though some national federation manuals say we do not.
8. Class leaders, go over pregame duties.
9. This may be a mechanics change shortly, but right now we should have at least two officials at that spot, the BJ and the LJ. Common sense prevails when all else fails.
